To the Medical Dermatology Society:

Thank you for awarding me the 2010 Mentorship award to work with Dr. Dirk Elston at Geisinger Medical Center in Danville, Pennsylvania.

Despite Danville being entrenched in several feet of snow during January, the Dermatology residents were extremely warm and hospitable. During my month I joined the residents in their education sessions including book review, "kodachromes", dermatopathology, etc. Attendings and clinic staff were generous with their time and welcomed me to join their clinics. During the afternoons, I participated in daily sign out with the Dermatopathology fellows, Dermatology residents and Dr. Elston. In addition to attending dermatopathology sign-out, I had the tremendous opportunity to review slides from an annotated collection of greater than 10,000 glass slides.

Unique aspects of my elective involved reviewing infectious disease-related cutaneous pathology and generating digital images (>1,000) to be compiled in a dermatopathology atlas of infectious diseases.
